It is hoped that the Government-backed plans to bring in a law to stop people who attack police dogs and horses from claiming self defence hopefully will come back to the Commons on July 6th.

Environment Secretary Michael Gove had supported the so-called "Finn's law", debated in the House of Commons. The Bill was tabled by Conservative MP Sir Oliver Heald.

It is named after police dog Finn, who needed surgery when he was stabbed in the head and chest while on duty in October 2016.

In addition to ensuring that dogs are kept in suitable accommodation, the law also places limits on

the frequency and timing of breeding from a bitch. Bitches cannot be mated before they are a year old,

They must have no more than 6 litters in a lifetime and can only have one litter every 12 months.
